Bob Wells Award Nominations Being Sought

Bob Wells (1945 – 2013) was a Farm Management Field Specialist at Iowa State University Extension and Outreach. His interest in educational programs for farm women piqued in 2003 when he heard Ruth Hambleton talk about her new Annie's Project program at the Risk Management Educators Conference held in Dallas Texas in 2003. Through Bob's leadership and hard work, Annie's Project grew to impact more than 8,000 farm and ranch women in 34 states. In September 2013, he received an award from his peers in recognition of ten years of outstanding dedication and excellence in educational programing by fulfilling the Annie's Project – Education for Farm Women mission. Just two weeks after receiving that award, Bob Wells passed away.

The purpose of this award is to recognize Bob and other educators who share his passion for educating farm and ranch women, his skillfulness in teaching farm management, and his leadership and vision in bringing the resources together to deliver impactful programs.
